

#### FROM THE LIBRARY DIRECTOR,

Hello, again! While our library staff continues to plan excellent and engaging programs and provide excellent services to the public right now, I'm very busy with budget planning for our next fiscal year. Unfortunately, this process uncovered an unwelcome surprise for me. As Friends and supporters of the library I wanted to let you know that the library is projecting up to a 6% budget shortfall, and unfortunately we don't have the capacity to absorb that loss due to our library fund balance (essentially our "savings account") being consistently depleted because of years of financial losses. Right now we are facing the prospect of making cuts to the library to help bridge this gap and break even.

This is unwelcome news, and probably surprising to some of you. Library staff are so excellent at carrying on through tough financial times and operating on a shoestring, and it's hard to understand facing the prospect of service cuts and layoffs with a (slightly) positive economic forecast for the next fiscal year. However, our level of funding (as a % of property tax revenue) hasn't changed substantially since 1978, and we're trying to operate a 2017 library with a funding formula from a bygone time.

As dedicated supporters of the library, I need your help. In order to drum up greater community support for the library I need you to talk to your friends and neighbors about what this library means to you. Tell stories. Talk

about the library's importance to the community. Call influential friends and community "movers and shakers" and let them know that you value library services in Humboldt County. Feel free to talk openly about our challenges, and let the community know that it's only through their understanding and support that we will be able to thrive and grow.

Also, in light of this news, I want to reemphasize the importance of your support and volunteer work on behalf of the library system. We would be in a much more perilous position if not for you.

I would like to underscore the concern that Vanessa has expressed. While our newsletter often shares the financial successes of the Friends through our book sales and the Serendipity Book Store, it is important to

remember that the money donated by the FRL and other Friends groups is used to support library activities, but it does not supplant the Library's budget!



# \$500,000!

The Serendipity Book Store opened its doors in October, 1999, the "brain-child of Past President and



long time Friends of the Redwood Libraries' volunteer, Frances Rapin. The Book Store, located on the second floor of the Eureka Main Library, recently passed the \$500,000 mark in total sales since its beginning. It is run totally by

volunteers and sells books, media and a few other items that have been donated.

Stephanie Hillman reminds us that it is important to note that sales from other sources have also played a significant part in providing the funds we are able to donate to the Library. From its launch in May 2000 through June 30, 2016, our internet sales operation raised \$111,273 and from July 2004 through the end of fiscal 2015-16 our quarterly book sales raised another \$62,777. These sales, together with those in the book store and monetary donations and membership dues above the basic level, made it possible for the Friends to provide gifts totaling \$652,450 during the period from July 1, 1999, to June 30, 2016. This impressive figure was only possible because of the support and generosity of our Friends and members of the public who support our sales. Thank you to all of you!

# AUTHOR FESTIVAL

### **IS COMING**

The Author Festival committee is preparing for another wonderful event. The festival is produced biennially on odd numbered years, so the next one will be October 18-21, 2017.

The Children's Author Festival is unique in that it transports 25 authors to 60 schools in Humboldt County. About 13,000 students get to meet and interact with an author! Authors inspire students to want to read and write!

In order to have the Author Festival it is necessary to raise \$20,500 from the community to supplement the \$24,000 that is received from three foundations, the book



sale, and school registration fees. The Friends of the Redwood Libraries supports the Author Festival with an annual gift of \$1,500.


## Friends of the Fortuna Library
